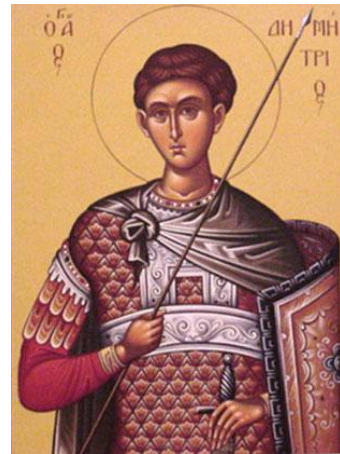
From Fr. Deacon Stephen:

St. Demetrius - Great Martyr, October 26

St. Demetrius belongs to the number of warrior martyrs. He appears in the uniform of a soldier and is shown with armor. The Church does not consider the condition of soldier as incompatible with the quality of a Christian. It does not oppose a Christian embracing a military career to defend Christian values. "Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends." (John 15:13). St. Demetrius suffered martyrdom at the beginning of the 14th century during the persecution of Diocletian. He is shown full-face. He is shown in armor with a cloak thrown over his shoulder and armed with a lance and sword.
